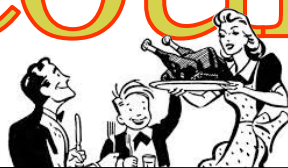

Did you know ...

Interesting Facts About Libraries

- The **oldest continually running library in the world** is at the St. Catherine's Monastery in the Sinai, Egypt. It was built in the middle of the 6th century and houses the second largest collection of religious material in the world (after the Vatican). However it is not accessible to the public, only by monks and invited scholars. The bibliotheque de Paris (Library of Paris) combined with the National Library of France, is the oldest continually running public library service, dating back to 1368 when it was housed at the Louvre.
- The **largest library** in the world is The Library of Congress, with more than 158 million items on approximately 838 miles of bookshelves. The collections include more than 36 million books and other print materials.
- The **first recorded librarian** was Zenodotus of Ephesus, holding that post from the end of Ptolemy I's reign. He was a Greek grammarian, literary critic, Homeric scholar and the first librarian of the Library of Alexandria. He might be considered the originator of the library idea.
- The **first Bookmobile** – The British Workman reported in 1857 a perambulating library operating in a circle of eight villages in Cumbria. A Victorian merchant and philanthropist, George Moore, created the project to "diffuse good literature among the rural population."
