How Valuable is Your Library ~PRICELESS~

In a stringent economy families and individuals are making it a priority to save money, entertain cheaply, cut back in general, and seek out alternative resources for day-to-day living. It's during a time such as this that people turn to their local library for low-cost entertainment, free access to information resources, free book rental, and no-cost technology use such as Internet, Word Processing, Email, and much more.



Libraries nationwide tailor their services to meet the needs of their respective communities. Such opportunities include computer classes, informative/how-to workshops, programming for all ages, job-search resources, exploration of the arts, agency-to-agency networking, and other numerous uses. So, how much is the average patron saving by using the public library?

The American Library Association recently made available an online tool called the *Library Value Calculator*. This tool was created by the Massachusetts Library Association to demonstrate to individuals and families the value of their library experiences. This calculator converts patron use of library services into a monetary value so that people can see, on average, how much those experiences would cost them in a non-library world.

Let's look at what a patron would be spending without a neighborhood library. The following values are based on 1 month's use.

- ◆ 2 books= \$34
- ◆ 3 magazines= \$15
- ◆ 2 movies= \$8
- 1 audio book= \$10
- meeting room use per hour= \$50
- ◆ 2 adult programs and classes attended= \$30
- ◆ 2 children's programs attended= \$14
- ♦ 2 hours of computer use= \$24
- ◆ 1-time use of a database= \$20

Total \$ spent= \$205

While the quantity of items or services used above are relatively conservative the total money spent is astronomical! Now, put the library back in the community and you will see a *savings* of \$205. Libraries, without at doubt, provide significant saving opportunities for their communities.


